ORDER FOR NOTICE AND HEARING

On January 20, 2021, Virginia Electric and Power Company d/b/a Dominion Energy Virginia ("Dominion" or "Company") filed with the State Corporation Commission ("Commission") an application for approval and certification to construct and operate electric transmission facilities in York and James City Counties and the City of Williamsburg, Virginia ("Application"). Dominion filed the Application pursuant to § 56-46.1 of the Code of Virginia ("Code") and the Utility Facilities Act, Code § 56-265.1 *et seq.*

Dominion seeks to (i) rebuild approximately 3.8 miles of the existing 230 kilovolt ("kV") Line #2113 on single circuit steel structures between Lightfoot Substation and Waller Substation; (ii) remove approximately 3.8 miles of idle 115 kV Line #58 between Lightfoot Substation and Waller Substation; and (iii) perform related substation work at Lanexa, Lightfoot, and Waller Substations.<sup>1</sup> Additionally, Dominion seeks to (i) rebuild approximately 6.1 miles of 230 kV Line #2154 on single circuit steel structures between Waller Substation and Kingsmill Substation; (ii) rebuild approximately 1.5 miles of 230 kV Line #2154 on double circuit steel structures between Kingsmill Substation and Structure #2154/482; (iii) remove approximately

6.1 miles of idle 115 kV Line #58 between Waller Substation and Kingsmill Substation; (iv) rebuild approximately 1.5 miles of 115 kV Line #19 on double circuit steel structures between Kingsmill Substation and Structure #2154/482; and (v) perform related substation work at Waller, Penniman, and Kingsmill Substations and Skiffes Creek Switching Station (collectively, the "Rebuild Projects").<sup>2</sup>

Dominion states that the Rebuild Projects are necessary to maintain the structural integrity and reliability of its transmission system in compliance with mandatory North American Electric Reliability Corporation Reliability Standards.<sup>3</sup> The Company further states that the Rebuild Projects will replace aging infrastructure that is at the end of its service life.<sup>4</sup>

The Company states that the desired in-service date for the Rebuild Projects is September 30, 2023.<sup>5</sup> The Company represents that the estimated conceptual cost of the Rebuild Projects (in 2020 dollars) is approximately \$27.4 million, which includes approximately \$25.3 million for transmission-related work and \$2.1 million for substation-related work.<sup>6</sup>

Dominion represents that, given the availability of existing right-of-way ("ROW"), the statutory preference given to the use of existing ROW, and because of the additional costs and environmental impacts that would be associated with the acquisition and construction of new

ROW, the Company considered no alternate routes requiring new ROW for the Rebuild Projects.<sup>7</sup>

As provided by Code § 62.1-44.15:21 D 2, the Commission and the State Water Control Board ("Board") must consult on wetland impacts prior to the siting of electric utility facilities that require a certificate of public convenience and necessity. Acting on behalf of the Board, the Department of Environmental Quality ("DEQ") must prepare a Wetland Impacts Consultation on this Application, as required by the Code and Sections 2 and 3 of the Department of Environmental Quality - State Corporation Commission Memorandum of Agreement Regarding Consultation on Wetland Impacts.<sup>8</sup> The Staff of the Commission ("Staff") has requested the Office of Wetlands & Stream Protection at the DEQ to provide a Wetland Impacts Consultation for the Rebuild Projects.<sup>9</sup>

As provided by Code §§ 10.1-1186.2:1 B and 56-46.1 A, the Commission and the DEQ must coordinate reviews of the environmental impact of electric generating plants and associated facilities. Pursuant to the Code and consistent with the Department of Environmental Quality - State Corporation Commission Memorandum of Agreement Regarding Coordination of Reviews of the Environmental Impacts of Proposed Electric Generating Plants and Associated Facilities (August 2002),<sup>10</sup> the Commission receives and considers reports on the proposed

facilities from state environmental agencies. Staff has requested the DEQ to coordinate an environmental review of this Application by the appropriate agencies and to provide a report on the review.<sup>11</sup>

NOW THE COMMISSION, upon consideration of the Application and applicable statutes, finds that: this matter should be docketed; Dominion should give notice of its Application to interested persons and the public; a public hearing should be scheduled for the purpose of receiving testimony and evidence on the Application; interested persons should have an opportunity to file comments on the Application or participate as a respondent in this proceeding; and the Staff should be directed to investigate the Application and file testimony and exhibits containing its findings and recommendations thereon. Finally, we find that this matter should be assigned to a Hearing Examiner to conduct all further proceedings in this matter on behalf of the Commission.

The Commission further takes judicial notice of the ongoing public health emergency related to the spread of the coronavirus, or COVID-19, and the declarations of emergency issued at both the state and federal levels.<sup>12</sup> The Commission has taken certain actions, and may take additional actions going forward, that could impact the procedures in this proceeding.<sup>13</sup>

Consistent with these actions, in regard to the terms of the procedural framework established below, the Commission will, among other things, direct the electronic filing of testimony and pleadings, unless they contain confidential information, and require electronic service on parties to this proceeding.

Accordingly, IT IS ORDERED THAT:

(1) This matter is docketed and assigned Case No. PUR-2021-00010.

(2) All pleadings in this matter shall be submitted electronically to the extent authorized by 5 VAC 5-20-150, *Copies and format*, of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure ("Rules of Practice").<sup>14</sup> Confidential and Extraordinarily Sensitive Information shall not be submitted electronically and should comply with 5 VAC 5-20-170, *Confidential information*, of the Rules of Practice. For the duration of the COVID-19 emergency, any person seeking to hand deliver and physically file or submit any pleading or other document shall contact the Clerk's Office Document Control Center at (804) 371-9838 to arrange the delivery.<sup>15</sup>

(3) Pursuant to 5 VAC 5-20-140, *Filing and service*, of the Commission's Rules of Practice, the Commission directs that service on parties and the Staff in this matter shall be accomplished by electronic means. Concerning Confidential or Extraordinarily Sensitive

Information, parties and the Staff are instructed to work together to agree upon the manner in which documents containing such information shall be served upon one another, to the extent practicable, in an electronically protected manner, even if such information is unable to be filed in the Office of the Clerk, so that no party or the Staff is impeded from preparing its case.

(4) As provided by § 12.1-31 of the Code and Rule 5 VAC 5-20-120, *Procedure before hearing examiners*, of the Commission's Rules of Practice, a Hearing Examiner is appointed to conduct all further proceedings in this matter on behalf of the Commission and to file a final report.

(5) Due to the ongoing public health emergency related to the spread of the coronavirus, or COVID-19, the Commission hereby schedules a telephonic hearing for the receipt of testimony from public witnesses on the Application, as follows:

- A hearing for the receipt of testimony from public witnesses on the Application shall be convened telephonically at 10 a.m., on July 19, 2021, with no witness present in the Commission's courtroom.<sup>16</sup>
- To promote fairness for all public witnesses, each witness will be allotted five minutes to provide testimony.
- On or before July 15, 2021, any person desiring to offer testimony as a public witness shall provide to the Commission (a) your name, and (b) the telephone number that you wish the Commission to call during the hearing to receive your testimony. Further details on this hearing will be provided by subsequent Commission Order or Hearing Examiner's Ruling.

(8) On or before March 23, 2021, the Company shall cause to be sent by first class mail a copy of the notice and sketch map prescribed in Ordering Paragraph (9) to all owners, as of the date of this Order, of property within the route of the proposed Rebuild Projects, as indicated on the map or sketch of the route filed with the Commission, which requirement shall be satisfied by mailing to such persons at such addresses as are indicated in the land books maintained by the commissioner of revenue, director of finance, treasurer, or other officer of the county or municipality designated as provided by Code § 58.1-3100 *et seq.*

(9) On or before March 23, 2021, the Company shall cause the following notice and the sketch map of the proposed route appearing on page 277 of the Appendix to the Application to be published as display advertising (not classified) on one occasion in newspapers of general circulation in York and James City Counties and the City of Williamsburg, Virginia:

Additionally, Dominion seeks to (i) rebuild approximately 6.1 miles of 230 kV Line #2154 on single circuit steel structures between Waller Substation and Kingsmill Substation; (ii) rebuild approximately 1.5 miles of 230 kV Line #2154 on double circuit steel structures between Kingsmill Substation and Structure #2154/482; (iii) remove approximately 6.1 miles of idle 115 kV Line #58 between Waller Substation and Kingsmill Substation; (iv) rebuild approximately 1.5 miles of 115 kV Line #19 on double circuit steel structures between Kingsmill Substation and Structure #2154/482; and (v) perform related substation work at Waller, Penniman, and Kingsmill Substations and Skiffes Creek Switching Station (collectively, the "Rebuild Projects").

Dominion states that the Rebuild Projects are necessary to maintain the structural integrity and reliability of its transmission system in compliance with mandatory North American Electric Reliability Corporation Reliability Standards. The Company further states that the Rebuild Projects will replace aging infrastructure that is at the end of its service life.



The Company states that the desired in-service date for the Rebuild Projects is September 30, 2023. The Company represents that the estimated conceptual cost of the Rebuild Projects (in 2020 dollars) is approximately \$27.4 million, which includes approximately \$25.3 million for transmission-related work and \$2.1 million for substation-related work.

Dominion represents that, given the availability of existing right-of-way ("ROW"), the statutory preference given to the use of existing ROW, and because of the additional costs and environmental impacts that would be associated with the acquisition and construction of new ROW, the Company considered no alternate routes requiring new ROW for the Rebuild Projects.

The proposed route for the proposed Rebuild Projects is an approximate 11.4-mile ROW currently occupied by an existing 230 kV transmission Line #2113 (from Lightfoot Substation to Waller Substation) and Line #2154 (from Waller Substation to Structure #2154/482). The existing transmission line corridor ROW, which varies from 150 to 200 feet wide, originates from the Lightfoot Substation in James City County, traverses briefly through the City of Williamsburg, continues to Waller Substation in York County, traverses briefly again through the City of Williamsburg, and continues to Penniman Substation. From this point, the line heads to Kingsmill Substation in York County, and then terminates at Structure #2154/482 just before reaching the Skiffes Creek Switching Station off Highway 60 in York County.

The minimum proposed height for structures being replaced on Line # 2113 is 52 feet (compared to the current minimum of 53 feet), the maximum proposed structure height is 84 feet (compared to the current maximum of 84 feet), and the average proposed structure height is approximately 65 feet (compared to the current average of 61 feet).

The minimum proposed height for structures being replaced on Line # 2154 is 70 feet (compared to the current minimum of 56 feet), the maximum proposed structure height is 85 feet (compared to the current maximum of 81 feet), and the average proposed structure height is 72 feet (compared to the current average of 67 feet).

All distances, heights, and directions are approximate. A sketch map of the proposal accompanies this notice. A more

The Commission may consider a route not significantly different from the routes described in this notice without additional notice to the public.

Any organization, corporation, or government body participating as a respondent must be represented by counsel as required by 5 VAC 5-20-30, *Counsel*, of the Rules of Practice. All filings shall refer to Case No. PUR-2021-00010.

(15) Within five (5) business days of receipt of a notice of participation as a respondent, the Company shall serve upon the respondent a copy of the Application and supporting materials, unless these materials already have been provided to the respondent.

(16) On or before June 1, 2021, each respondent may file with the Clerk of the Commission and serve on the Staff, the Company, and all other respondents, any testimony and exhibits by which the respondent expects to establish its case, and each witness's testimony shall include a summary not to exceed one page. In all filings, respondents shall comply with the

Commission's Rules of Practice, as modified herein, including, but not limited to:

5 VAC 5-20-140, *Filing and service*, and 5 VAC 5-20-240, *Prepared testimony and exhibits*.

All filings shall refer to Case No. PUR-2021-00010.

(17) The Staff shall investigate the Application. On or before June 22, 2021, the Staff shall file with the Clerk of the Commission an original and fifteen (15) copies of testimony and exhibits, and each Staff witness' testimony shall include a summary not to exceed one page. The Staff shall serve a copy thereof on counsel to the Company and all respondents.

(18) On or before July 6, 2021, Dominion shall file with the Clerk of the Commission any rebuttal testimony and exhibits that it expects to offer, and each rebuttal witness' testimony shall include a summary not to exceed one page. The Company shall serve a copy of its rebuttal testimony and exhibits on the Staff and all respondents.

(19) All documents filed in paper form with the Office of the Clerk of the Commission in this docket may use both sides of the paper. In all other respects, except as modified herein, all filings shall comply fully with the requirements of 5 VAC 5-20-150, *Copies and format*, of the Commission's Rules of Practice.

(20) The Commission's Rule of Practice 5 VAC 5-20-260, *Interrogatories to parties or requests for production of documents and things*, shall be modified for this proceeding as follows: responses and objections to written interrogatories and requests for production of documents shall be served within seven (7) calendar days after receipt of the same. In addition to the service requirements of 5 VAC 5-20-260 of the Rules of Practice, on the day that copies are filed with the Clerk of the Commission, a copy of the interrogatory or request for production shall be served electronically on the party to whom the interrogatory or request for production is directed or the assigned Staff attorney, if the interrogatory or request for production is directed to

the Staff.<sup>18</sup> Except as modified herein, discovery shall be in accordance with Part IV of the Commission's Rules of Practice, 5 VAC 5-20-240 *et seq.*

(21) This matter is continued.
