To revise its fuel factor pursuant to § 56-249.6 of the Code of Virginia

ORDER ESTABLISHING 2024-2025 FUEL FACTOR PROCEEDING

On February 20, 2024, Kentucky Utilities Company d/b/a Old Dominion Power Company ("KU/ODP" or "Company") filed with the State Corporation Commission ("Commission"), pursuant to § 56-249.6 of the Code of Virginia ("Code"), its application proposing to decrease its levelized fuel factor by \$0.00953 per kilowatt-hour ("kWh") to \$0.02581 per kWh, effective for service rendered on and after April 1, 2024 ("Application").¹ According to KU/ODP, the proposed fuel factor represents a decrease of \$9.53 per month for a residential customer using 1,000 kWh per month.² In addition, KU/ODP filed a Motion for Protective Order ("Motion") in accordance with 5 VAC 5-20-170 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure, 5 VAC 5-20-10 *et seq.* ("Rules of Practice").

NOW THE COMMISSION, upon consideration of this matter, is of the opinion and finds that this matter should be docketed; KU/ODP should provide public notice of its Application; a public hearing should be scheduled for the purpose of receiving testimony and evidence on the Application;³ interested persons should have an opportunity to file comments on the Application

or participate as a respondent in this proceeding; and the Commission's Staff ("Staff") should be directed to investigate the Application and file testimony and exhibits containing its findings and recommendations thereon. We find that the proposed fuel factor should take effect for service rendered on and after April 1, 2024, on an interim basis and subject to modification by further order of the Commission.

We also find that a Hearing Examiner should be assigned to conduct all further proceedings in this matter on behalf of the Commission, including ruling on the Company's Motion and filing a final report containing the Hearing Examiner's findings and recommendations.

To promote administrative efficiency and timely service of filings upon participants, the Commission will, among other things, direct the electronic filing of testimony and pleadings unless they contain confidential information, and require electronic service on parties to this proceeding.

Accordingly, IT IS ORDERED THAT:

(1) This matter is docketed and assigned Case No. PUR-2024-00026.

(2) The proposed levelized fuel factor shall take effect for service rendered on and after April 1, 2024 on an interim basis and subject to modification by further order of the Commission.

(3) All pleadings in this matter shall be submitted electronically to the extent authorized by 5 VAC 5-20-150, *Copies and format*, of the Commission's Rules of Practice. Confidential and Extraordinarily Sensitive Information shall not be submitted electronically and should comply with 5 VAC 5-20-170, *Confidential information*, of the Rules of Practice. Any person

seeking to hand deliver and physically file or submit any pleading or other document shall contact the Clerk's Office Document Control Center at (804) 371-9838 to arrange the delivery.

(4) As provided by Code § 12.1-31 and 5 VAC 5-20-120, *Procedure before hearing examiners*, of the Commission's Rules of Practice, a Hearing Examiner is appointed to conduct all further proceedings in this matter on behalf of the Commission, including ruling on the Company's Motion for Protective Order. A copy of each filing made with the Commission's Clerk's office in this matter shall also be sent electronically to the Office of the Hearing Examiners.⁴

(5) Pursuant to 5 VAC 5-20-140, *Filing and service*, of the Commission's Rules of Practice, the Commission directs that service on parties and the Staff in this matter shall be accomplished by electronic means. Concerning Confidential or Extraordinarily Sensitive Information, parties and the Staff are instructed to work together to agree upon the manner in which documents containing such information shall be served upon one another, to the extent practicable, in an electronically protected manner, even if such information is unable to be filed in the Office of the Clerk, so that no party or the Staff is impeded from preparing its case.

(6) The Commission hereby schedules a telephonic hearing for the receipt of testimony from public witnesses on the Company's Application, as follows:

- (a) A hearing for the receipt of testimony from public witnesses on the Company's Application shall be convened telephonically at 10 a.m. on July 16, 2024, with no public witness present in the Commission's courtroom.⁵
- (b) To promote fairness for all public witnesses, each witness will be allotted five minutes to provide testimony.

- (d) Beginning at 10 a.m. on July 16, 2024, the Hearing Examiner appointed to this case will telephone sequentially each person who has signed up to testify as provided above.
- (e) This public witness hearing will be webcast at <u>scc.virginia.gov/pages/Webcasting</u>.

(7) The evidentiary portion of the hearing on the Application shall be convened at

10 a.m. on July 16, 2024, or at the conclusion of the public witness portion of the hearing,

whichever is later, by electronic means, to receive the testimony and evidence of the Company,

any respondents, and the Staff.

On February 20, 2024, Kentucky Utilities Company d/b/a Old Dominion Power Company ("KU/ODP" or "Company") filed with the State Corporation Commission ("Commission"), pursuant to § 56-249.6 of the Code of Virginia, its application proposing to decrease its levelized fuel factor by \$0.00953 per kilowatt-hour ("kWh") to \$0.02581 per kWh, effective for service rendered on and after April 1, 2024 ("Application"). According to KU/ODP, the proposed fuel factor represents an decrease of \$9.53 per month for a residential customer using 1,000 kWh per month.

The proposed increase in the fuel factor will take effect for service rendered on and after April 1, 2024, on an interim basis and subject to modification by further order of the Commission.

The Commission entered an Order Establishing 2024-2025 Fuel Factor Proceeding that, among other things, scheduled public hearings on KU/ODP's Application. On July 16, 2024, at 10 a.m., the Hearing Examiner assigned will hold a telephonic hearing, with no witness present in the Commission's courtroom, for the purpose of receiving the testimony of public witnesses. On July 10, 2024, any person desiring to offer testimony as a public witness shall provide to the Commission (a) your name, and (b) the telephone number that you wish the Commission to call during the hearing to receive your testimony. This information may be provided to the Commission in three ways: (i) by filling out a form on the Commission's website at scc.virginia.gov/pages/Webcasting; (ii) by completing and emailing the PDF version of this form to SCCInfo@scc.virginia.gov; or (iii) by calling (804) 371-9141. This public witness hearing will be webcast at scc.virginia.gov/pages/Webcasting.

Beginning at 10 a.m. on July 16, 2024, the Hearing Examiner will telephone sequentially each person who has signed up to testify as provided above.

On July 16, 2024, at 10 a.m., or at the conclusion of the public witness portion of the hearing, whichever is later, the Hearing Examiner will convene a hearing by electronic means to receive testimony and evidence from the Company, any respondents, and the Commission's Staff. To promote administrative efficiency and timely service of filings upon participants, the Commission has directed the electronic filing of testimony and pleadings, unless they contain confidential information, and required electronic service on parties to this proceeding.

Those unable, as a practical matter, to file a notice of participation electronically may file such notice by U.S. mail to the Clerk of the Commission at the address listed above. Such notice of participation shall include the email addresses of such parties or their counsel, if available. The respondent shall serve a copy of the notice of participation on counsel to the Company. Pursuant to 5 VAC 5-20-80 B, Participation as a respondent, of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure ("Rules of Practice"), any notice of participation shall set forth: (i) a precise statement of the interest of the respondent; (ii) a statement of the specific action sought to the extent then known; and (iii) the factual and legal basis for the action. Any organization, corporation, or government body participating as a respondent must be represented by counsel as required by 5 VAC 5-20-30, Counsel, of the Rules of Practice. All filings shall refer to Case No. PUR-2024-00026.

On or before June 7, 2024, each respondent may file with the Clerk of the Commission any testimony and exhibits by which the respondent expects to establish its case. Any respondent unable, as a practical matter, to file testimony and exhibits electronically may file such by U.S. mail to the Clerk of the Commission at the address listed above. Each witness's testimony shall include a summary not to exceed one page. All testimony and exhibits shall be served on the Commission's Staff, the Company, and all other respondents. In all filings, respondents shall comply with the Rules of Practice, including 5 VAC 5-20-140, *Filing and service*, and 5 VAC 5-20-240, *Prepared testimony and exhibits*. All filings shall refer to Case No. PUR-2024-00026.

Any documents filed in paper form with the Office of the Clerk of the Commission in this docket may use both sides of the paper. In all other respects, except as modified by the Commission's Order, all filings shall comply fully with the requirements of 5 VAC 5-20-150, *Copies and format*, of the Rules of Practice.

(11) On or before May 17, 2024, the Company shall provide proof of the notice and service required by Ordering Paragraphs (9) and (10), including the name, title, and address of each official served, with the Clerk of the Commission at <u>scc.virginia.gov/clk/efiling</u>.

(12) On or before July 10, 2024, any interested person may submit written comments on the Application by following the instructions found on the Commission's website:

submit comments electronically may file such comments by U.S. mail to the Clerk of the State

(13) On or before May 24, 2024, any person or entity wishing to participate as a respondent in this proceeding may do so by filing a notice of participation at <u>sec.virginia.gov/clk/efiling</u>. Those unable, as a practical matter, to file a notice of participation electronically may file such notice by U.S. mail to the Clerk of the Commission at the address listed in Ordering Paragraph (12). Such notice of participation shall include the email addresses of such parties or their counsel, if available. The respondent shall serve a copy of the notice of participation on counsel to the Company. Pursuant to 5 VAC 5-20-80 B, *Participation as a respondent*, of the Rules of Practice, any notice of participation shall set forth: (i) a precise statement of the interest of the respondent; (ii) a statement of the specific action sought to the extent then known; and (iii) the factual and legal basis for the action. Any organization, corporation, or government body participating as a respondent must be represented by counsel as required by 5 VAC 5-20-30, *Counsel*, of the Rules of Practice. All filings shall refer to Case No. PUR-2024-00026.

(14) Within three (3) business days of receipt of a notice of participation as a respondent, the Company shall serve a copy of the Application on the respondent, unless it has already been provided to the respondent.

(15) On or before June 7, 2024, each respondent may file with the Clerk of the Commission, at <u>scc.virginia.gov/clk/efiling</u>, any testimony and exhibits by which the respondent expects to establish its case. Any respondent unable, as a practical matter, to file testimony and exhibits electronically may file such by U.S. mail to the Clerk of the Commission at the address in Ordering Paragraph (12). Each witness's testimony shall include a summary not to exceed one page. All testimony and exhibits shall be served on the Staff, the Company, and all other respondents. In all filings, respondents shall comply with the Rules of Practice, as modified

herein, including, but not limited to: 5 VAC 5-20-140, *Filing and service*, and 5 VAC 5-20-240, *Prepared testimony and exhibits*. All filings shall refer to Case No. PUR-2024-00026.

(16) On or before June 21, 2024, the Staff shall investigate the Application and file with the Clerk of the Commission its testimony and exhibits concerning the Application, and each Staff witness's testimony shall include a summary not to exceed one page. A copy thereof shall be served on counsel to the Company and all respondents.

(17) On or before July 3, 2024, KU/ODP shall file with the Clerk of the Commission any rebuttal testimony and exhibits that it expects to offer, and each rebuttal witness's testimony shall include a summary not to exceed one page. The Company shall serve a copy of its rebuttal testimony and exhibits on the Staff and all respondents.

(18) Any documents filed in paper form with the Office of the Clerk of the Commission in this docket may use both sides of the paper. In all other respects, except as modified herein, all filings shall comply fully with the requirements of 5 VAC 5-20-150, *Copies and format*, of the Rules of Practice.

(19) The Commission's Rule of Practice 5 VAC 5-20-260, *Interrogatories or requests for production of documents and things*, shall be modified for this proceeding as follows: responses and objections to written interrogatories and requests for production of documents shall be served within five (5) calendar days after receipt of the same. In addition to the service requirements of 5 VAC 5-20-260 of the Rules of Practice, on the day that copies are filed with the Clerk of the Commission, a copy of the interrogatory or request for production shall be served electronically on the party to whom the interrogatory or request for production is directed to the

Staff.⁶ Except as modified herein, discovery shall be in accordance with Part IV of the Rules of Practice, 5 VAC 5-20-240 *et seq*.
