ORDER FOR NOTICE AND COMMENT

On June 3, 2020, Kentucky Utilities Company d/b/a Old Dominion Power Company ("KU-ODP" or "Company") filed with the State Corporation Commission ("Commission") an application for approval and certificates of public convenience and necessity ("CPCN") for structure replacements on three 161 kilovolt ("kV") transmission lines within the Company's existing rights-of-way in Lee and Wise Counties, Virginia ("Application"). KU-ODP filed the Application pursuant to § 56-46.1 of the Code of Virginia ("Code") and the Utility Facilities Act, Code § 56-265.1 et seq.

KU-ODP seeks to replace certain wood structures with galvanized steel structures on three separate l61 kV transmission circuits, entirely within its existing rights-of-way (collectively, "Rebuild Project"). Specifically, the Company proposes to complete the following:

(1) Dorchester to Arnold, 14.4 miles: remove and replace 27 wood structures and repair 6 structures currently ranging in height from 52 feet to 70 feet, with an average height of 60.20 feet. As proposed the new structures would range from 52 feet to 74.50 feet

- in height, with an average height of 63.17 feet. The estimated cost for this portion of the Rebuild Project is \$3.2 million;
- (2) Dorchester to Pocket North, 25.6 miles: remove and replace 89 wood structures and repair 22 structures currently ranging in height from 49.70 feet to 69.90 feet, with an average height of 57.45 feet. As proposed the new structures would range from 48.40 feet to 78.10 feet in height, with an average height of 60.41 feet. The estimated cost for this portion of the Rebuild Project is \$10.7 million; and
- (3) Harlan Wye to Pocket North, 5.2 miles: remove and replace 5 wood structures and repair 3 structures currently ranging in height from 52 feet to 65.50 feet, with an average height of 58.30 feet. As proposed the new structures would range from 56.50 feet to 70 feet in height, with an average height of 61.90 feet. The estimated cost for this portion of the Rebuild Project is \$0.9 million.²

The Company states that the Rebuild Project is required to ensure the longevity of KU-ODP's transmission infrastructure and to ensure the Company is equipped to comply with its mandate to provide reliable electric service to its Virginia customers.³ The Company further states that replacement of only those structures identified as defective with longer-lasting galvanized steel structures within the Company's existing rights-of-way is the least intrusive and lowest-cost means of ensuring transmission reliability long into the future, and the structure replacements are needed to ensure future compliance with transmission planning performance

requirements promulgated by the North American Electric Reliability Corporation and the Company's planning guidelines for reliability.⁴

The Company states that subject to the Commission's issuance of a CPCN, KU-ODP plans to complete the structure replacements and put them into service beginning in July 2021 and ending by October 2022.⁵ The Company represents that the estimated cost of the Rebuild Project is \$14.8 million.⁶

As provided by Code § 62.1-44.15:21 D 2, the Commission and the State Water Control Board ("Board") must consult on wetland impacts prior to the siting of electric utility facilities that require a certificate of public convenience and necessity. Acting on behalf of the Board, the Department of Environmental Quality ("DEQ") must prepare a Wetland Impacts Consultation on this Application, as required by the Code and Sections 2 and 3 of the Department of Environmental Quality - State Corporation Commission Memorandum of Agreement Regarding Consultation on Wetland Impacts.⁷ The Staff of the Commission ("Staff") has requested the Office of Wetlands & Stream Protection at the DEQ to provide a Wetland Impacts Consultation for the Rebuild Project.⁸

As provided by Code §§ 10.1-1186.2:1 B and 56-46.1 A, the Commission and the DEQ must coordinate reviews of the environmental impact of electric generating plants and associated

facilities. Pursuant to the Code and consistent with the Department of Environmental Quality - State Corporation Commission Memorandum of Agreement Regarding Coordination of Reviews of the Environmental Impacts of Proposed Electric Generating Plants and Associated Facilities (August 2002),⁹ the Commission receives and considers reports on the proposed facilities from state environmental agencies. The Staff has requested the DEQ to coordinate an environmental review of this Application by the appropriate agencies and to provide a report on the review.¹⁰

NOW THE COMMISSION, upon consideration of the Application and applicable statutes, finds that: this matter should be docketed; KU-ODP should give notice of its Application to interested persons and the public; a procedural schedule should be established to allow interested persons an opportunity to file comments and request a hearing on the Application; interested persons should have an opportunity to participate in this proceeding as a respondent; and the Staff should be directed to investigate the Application and file a report containing its findings and recommendations thereon ("Staff Report"). We further find that a Hearing Examiner should be assigned to rule on any discovery matters that may arise in this proceeding.

The Commission further takes judicial notice of the ongoing public health emergency related to the spread of the coronavirus, or COVID-19, and the declarations of emergency issued at both the state and federal levels.¹¹ The Commission has taken certain actions, and may take

additional actions going forward, that could impact the procedures in this proceeding. ¹²

Consistent with these actions, in regard to the terms of the procedural framework established below, the Commission will, among other things, direct the electronic filing of testimony and pleadings unless they contain confidential information, and require electronic service on parties to this proceeding.

Accordingly, IT IS ORDERED THAT:

Description of the Rebuild Project

The proposed Rebuild Project is located entirely within existing right-of-way or on Company-owned property in Lee and Wise Counties.

Dorchester-Arnold 161 kV

The existing transmission line right-of-way for this route, which is 150 feet wide, originates at KU-ODP's Dorchester Substation in Wise County, Virginia. The line leaves the substation and immediately crosses Dorchester Road. It heads to the northwest for approximately 4.9 miles to a point (structure 80) located approximately 5.2 miles northwest of Norton, Virginia. The right-of-way then proceeds to the west approximately 5.3 miles, crossing Route 600, to a point (structure 53) approximately

0.6 mile west of Stonega, Virginia. From this point the route heads northwest for approximately 4.2 miles and intersects the Virginia/Kentucky state line. The total length of the line in Virginia is 14.4 miles. The route continues in Kentucky to the northwest for approximately 2.1 miles and then turns to the southwest for approximately 4.3 miles before terminating at the Arnold Substation located in Harlan County, Kentucky.

Dorchester-Pocket North 161 kV

The existing transmission line right-of-way for this route is 25.6 miles long and is entirely within Virginia. The right-of-way varies between 100 and 150 feet wide and originates at KU-ODP's Dorchester Substation in Wise County, Virginia. The line leaves the substation and immediately crosses Dorchester Road. It heads to the west and runs parallel to an existing KU-ODP 69kV transmission line for approximately 2.2 miles to a point (structure 43) located approximately 0.4 mile northeast of the intersection between Kent Junction Road and Blackwood Road. The right-ofway then turns to the southwest and continues to parallel the existing 69 kV line for approximately 8.0 miles, crossing Roaring Branch Road (approximately 1.1 miles south of intersection with North Inman St.), and then enters Imboden Substation located in Wise County, Virginia. From Imboden Substation the route exits and continues southwest for approximately 14.7 miles to a point (structure 84-203) located approximately 0.8 mile southeast of St. Charles, Virginia. The right-of-way then turns southeast and runs approximately 0.7 mile before terminating at the Pocket Substation located in Lee County, Virginia.

Harlan Wye – Pocket North 161 kV

The existing transmission line right-of-way for this route, which is 150 feet wide, originates at KU-ODP's existing Pocket Substation in Lee County, Virginia. The line leaves the substation and heads northwest for approximately 0.7 mile to a point (structure 84A) located approximately 0.8 mile southeast of St. Charles, Virginia. The right-of-way then turns and proceeds to the southwest for approximately 4.5 miles crossing St. Charles Rd (approximately 1.1 miles north of intersection with VA-421) and intersects the Virginia/Kentucky state line. The total length of the line in Virginia is 5.2 miles. The route continues in Kentucky to the southwest for approximately 1.7 miles and then turns to the northwest for approximately 10.7 miles before terminating at the Harlan Y Substation located in Harlan County, Kentucky.

All distances, heights, and directions are approximate. A sketch map of the proposal accompanies this notice. A more detailed map may be viewed on the Commission's website: https://www.scc.virginia.gov/pages/Transmission-Line-Projects.

The Commission may consider a route not significantly different from the routes described in this notice without additional notice to the public.

Requests for hearing must include the email address of the filer or its counsel, along with: (i) a precise statement of the filing party's interest in the proceeding; (ii) a statement of the specific action sought to the extent

then known; (iii) a statement for the legal basis for such action; and (iv) a precise statement why the issues raised in the request for a hearing cannot be addressed adequately without a hearing.

Any request for hearing simultaneously shall be served on counsel to the Company. All requests for hearing shall refer to Case No. PUR-2020-00110.

- (15) The Staff shall investigate the Application. On or before September 30, 2020, the Staff shall file with the Clerk of the Commission a Staff Report containing its findings and recommendations. The Staff shall serve a copy thereof on counsel to the Company and all respondents.
- (16) On or before October 14, 2020, the Company may file with the Clerk of the Commission and serve on the Staff and all parties any response to the Staff Report and any comments filed by interested persons in this proceeding.
- (17) All documents filed with the Office of the Clerk of the Commission in this docket may use both sides of the paper. In all other respects, all filings shall comply fully with the requirements of 5 VAC 5-20-150, *Copies and format*, of the Commission's Rules of Practice.
- (18) The Commission's Rule of Practice 5 VAC 5-20-260, *Interrogatories to parties or requests for production of documents and things*, shall be modified for this proceeding as follows: responses and objections to written interrogatories and requests for production of documents shall be served within seven (7) calendar days after receipt of the same. In addition to the service requirements of 5 VAC 5-20-260 of the Rules of Practice, on the day that copies are filed with the Clerk of the Commission, a copy of the interrogatory or request for production shall be served electronically on the party to whom the interrogatory or request for production is directed or the assigned Staff attorney, if the interrogatory or request for production is directed to

the Staff.¹⁵ Except as modified herein, discovery shall be in accordance with Part IV of the Commission's Rules of Practice, 5 VAC 5-20-240 *et seq*.

(19) This matter is continued.
