ORDER FOR NOTICE AND COMMENT

On May 6, 2020, INTL FCStone Financial, Inc. ("INTL" or "Company"), filed an application with the State Corporation Commission ("Commission") for a license to act as an aggregator for electricity service ("Application").¹ INTL seeks authority to provide electricity aggregation services in the service territory of Virginia Electric and Power Company d/b/a Dominion Energy Virginia to eligible commercial, industrial, and governmental customers.² In its Application, INTL attested that it would abide by all applicable regulations of the Commission as required by 20 VAC 5-312-40 B of the Commission's Rules Governing Retail Access to Competitive Energy Services.³

NOW THE COMMISSION, upon consideration of the Application, is of the opinion and finds that it should docket INTL's Application; INTL should serve this Order upon the appropriate persons; the Commission's Staff ("Staff") shall conduct an investigation of the Application and present its findings in a report ("Staff Report"); and interested persons should have an opportunity to comment on the Application. We further find that a Hearing Examiner

should be appointed to rule on all discovery matters that arise during the course of this proceeding.

Accordingly, IT IS ORDERED THAT:

- (1) This matter is docketed and assigned Case No. PUR-2020-00082.
- (2) As provided by Code § 12.1-31 and 5 VAC 5-20-120, *Procedure before hearing examiners*, of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure ("Rules of Practice"),⁴ a Hearing Examiner is appointed to rule on all discovery matters that may arise during the course of this proceeding.
- (3) A copy of the Application may be viewed or downloaded from the Commission's website: <https://scc.virginia.gov/pages/Case-Information>.
- (4) On or before June 26, 2020, INTL shall serve a copy of this Order upon the utilities listed on Attachment A to this Order.⁵
- (5) In accordance with the Commission's revised operating procedures during the COVID-19 emergency, all comments, pleadings, and documents shall be submitted electronically to the Clerk of the Commission to the extent authorized by the Commission's Rules of Practice.⁶

The Company shall, within three (3) days of receipt of such request, serve the requested documents upon the person making such request.

(8) Comments on the Application may be filed on or before July 9, 2020, with the Clerk of the Commission at: <https://scc.virginia.gov/casecomments/Submit-Public-Comments> or at the mailing address in Ordering Paragraph (6). A copy of such comments, whether submitted in writing or electronically, shall be served upon the Company at the email address set forth in Ordering Paragraph (7). Such comments simultaneously shall be sent electronically to Richard Michaux, Sr. Utility Accountant, at Richard.Michaux@scc.virginia.gov. All comments shall refer to Case No. PUR-2020-00082.

(9) The Staff shall analyze INTL's Application and shall present its findings in a Staff Report to be filed on or before July 16, 2020.

(10) On or before July 23, 2020, the Company and any party who filed comments on the Application may file with the Clerk of the Commission an original and fifteen (15) copies of any response to the Staff Report.

(11) The Company shall respond to written interrogatories or data requests within five (5) calendar days after the receipt of the same. Interrogatories and data requests, as well as the responses thereto, shall be transmitted via electronic mail. Except as modified herein, discovery shall be in accordance with Part IV of the Commission's Rules of Practice.

(12) This matter is continued.
