ORDER FOR NOTICE AND HEARING

On August 23, 2024, Appalachian Power Company ("APCo" or "Company") filed with the State Corporation Commission ("Commission") a petition ("Petition") pursuant to § 56-585.1 A 5 b of the Code of Virginia ("Code") for approval of a rate adjustment clause ("DR-RAC") to recover costs related to the Company's peak shaving riders (Rider D.R.S.-RTO Capacity and Rider D.R.S.). Specifically, APCo requests that the Commission authorize the collection of a Virginia jurisdictional revenue requirement of \$1,424,691. APCo requests that the Commission authorize the revised DR-RAC to go into effect on June 1, 2025, and be collected over a 12-month period through May 31, 2026. APCo represents that the Company's proposed rates would increase the monthly bill for a residential customer using 1,000 kilowatt hours by \$0.13. Pursuant to Code § 56-585.1, the Commission must issue a final order regarding the Petition within eight months of filing.

APCo's requested Virginia jurisdictional revenue requirement of \$1,424,691 comprises:

(i) \$753,752 of uncollected balances associated with the Company's DR-RAC as of

July 31, 2024; and (ii) \$670,939 of projected costs associated with the customer that is currently on Rider D.R.S.-RTO Capacity from August 1, 2024, through May 31, 2025.⁵

APCo requests the Commission's approval to defer for future recovery the costs associated with the Company's Rider D.R.S.-RTO Capacity and Rider D.R.S.⁶ In support of its request, APCo states that Code §§ 56-585.1 A 5 b and 56-585.1 A 7 authorize the deferral of prudently incurred costs of peak-shaving (demand response) programs, and the Company asserts that the Commission has granted similar requests to defer costs associated with demand response riders.⁷

NOW THE COMMISSION, upon consideration of this matter, is of the opinion and finds that this matter should be docketed; APCo should provide public notice of its Petition; a hearing should be scheduled for the purpose of receiving testimony from public witnesses and evidence on the Petition; interested persons should have an opportunity to file comments on the Petition or participate as a respondent in this proceeding; and the Staff of the Commission ("Staff") should be directed to investigate the Petition and file testimony and exhibits containing its findings and recommendations thereon. Finally, we find this matter should be assigned to a Hearing Examiner to conduct all further proceedings in this matter on behalf of the Commission, including filing a final report containing the Hearing Examiner's findings and recommendations.

To promote administrative efficiency and timely service of filings upon participants, the Commission will, among other things, direct the electronic filing of testimony and pleadings

unless they contain confidential information, and require electronic service on parties to this proceeding.

Accordingly, IT IS ORDERED THAT:

- (1) This matter is docketed and assigned Case No. PUR-2024-00129.
- (2) All pleadings, briefs, or other documents required to be served in this matter shall be submitted electronically to the extent authorized by 5 VAC 5-20-150, *Copies and format*, of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure ("Rules of Practice"). Confidential and Extraordinarily Sensitive Information shall not be submitted electronically and should comply with 5 VAC 5-20-170, *Confidential information*, of the Rules of Practice. Any person seeking to hand deliver and physically file or submit any pleading or other document shall contact the Clerk's Office Document Control Center at (804) 371-9838 to arrange the delivery.
- (3) Pursuant to 5 VAC 5-20-140, *Filing and service*, of the Rules of Practice, the Commission directs that service on parties and Staff in this matter shall be accomplished by electronic means. Concerning Confidential or Extraordinarily Sensitive Information, all parties and Staff are instructed to work together to agree upon the manner in which documents containing such information shall be served upon one another, to the extent practicable, in an electronically protected manner, even if such information is unable to be filed in the Office of the Clerk, so that no party or Staff is impeded from preparing its case.
- (4) As provided by Code § 12.1-31 and 5 VAC 5-20-120, *Procedure before hearing examiners*, of the Rules of Practice, a Hearing Examiner is appointed to conduct all further proceedings in this matter on behalf of the Commission, including filing a final report containing the Hearing Examiner's findings and recommendations. A copy of each filing made with the

Commission's Clerk's office in this manner shall also be sent electronically to the Office of the Hearing Examiners.⁹

- (5) The Commission hereby schedules a telephonic portion of the hearing for the receipt of testimony from public witnesses on the Petition, as follows:
 - (a) The portion of the hearing for the receipt of testimony from public witnesses on the Petition shall be convened telephonically at 10 a.m. on January 29, 2025.
 - (b) To promote fairness for all public witnesses, each witness will be allotted five minutes to provide testimony.
 - (c) On or before January 22, 2025, any person desiring to offer testimony as a public witness shall provide to the Commission (a) your name, and (b) the telephone number that you wish the Commission to call during the hearing to receive your testimony. This information may be provided to the Commission in three ways: (i) by filling out a form on the Commission's website at scc.virginia.gov/pages/Webcasting; (ii) by completing and emailing the PDF version of this form to SCCInfo@scc.virginia.gov; or (iii) by calling (804) 371-9141.

APCo's requested Virginia jurisdictional revenue requirement of \$1,424,691 comprises: (i) \$753,752 of uncollected balances associated with the Company's DR-RAC as of July 31, 2024; and (ii) \$670,939 of projected costs associated with the customer that is currently on Rider D.R.S.-RTO Capacity from August 1, 2024, through May 31, 2025.

APCo requests the Commission's approval to defer for future recovery the costs associated with the Company's Rider D.R.S.-RTO Capacity and Rider D.R.S. In support of its request, APCo states that Code §§ 56-585.1 A 5 b and 56-585.1 A 7 authorize the deferral of prudently incurred costs of peak-shaving (demand response) programs, and the Company asserts that the Commission has granted similar requests to defer costs associated with demand response riders.
